What kind of seating is available for spectators? 1 stadium arena with 2000 seats Are there bleachers? Moveable seating? How many spectators can be accommodated? Other areas will have moveable bleachers and seats. **Over 3000 spectators can be seated at one time**

Does the venue have a controlled entrance point for admission purposes? **Yes** Is parking at the venue free? If not, what are the parking rates? **To be agreed with tournament organizers – optional**

Is there a concession stand available in the facility? Are there restaurants within a couple of miles of the facility? **Concessions, smoothie bar, sports nutrition area, restaurant and bar with food.** There are other restaurants within a couple of miles – but won't be needed



Airport: Harrisburg International Airport is served by seven major airlines, including Air Canada, AirTran Airways, American Eagle, Continental Airlines, Delta Air Lines, United Airlines and US Airways - which provide daily, nonstop service to 14 destinations with one-stop connections to cities around the world.

 Harrisburg International Airport has over 50 arrivals a day to our destination.
