<u>Date:</u> April 14-16, 2023

<u>Location:</u> Texas at the Round Rock Sports Center, Round Rock, Texas.

<u>Who:</u> Athletes from the 250+ top college table tennis players in the US and Canada, representing 50 and more of the top college teams; qualifying through divisional and regional play

<u>Why:</u> NCTTA National Champs is an annual event since 1993. This year's competition will include international players attending college in the United States that represented Brazil, Canada, China, Japan, India, New Zealand, Mexico, Taiwan and Hong Kong just to name a few.

III. HISTORY OF THE SPORT

- » Started as an upper-class parlor game in 19th century England
- » Developed into a competitive sport in the early 20th century; the first World Championships of the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) was held in 1926
- » An Olympic sport since 1988
- » The second most played sport in the world after soccer
- » Professional table tennis leagues exist in many countries; the most prominent are in China, Germany, Japan, Russia
- » The top table tennis players in the world earn ~\$1 million including endorsements
- » The table is 9 feet long, 5 feet wide, 2.5 feet high; the net is 6 inches high; the court space is 1000 square feet minimum
- » The ball is 40 mm in diameter and 2.7 grams in weight, traveling nearly 100mph and spinning at nearly 10,000 rpm
- » Matches consist of the best 4 out of 7 games (singles semifinals and finals) or best 3 out of 5 games (doubles events, early rounds of singles events, or team events). Games are first to 11 points, alternating serve every two points.

IV. ABOUT NCTTA COLLEGE TABLE TENNIS LEAGUE

- » The National Collegiate Table Tennis Association (NCTTA) is the governing body for college table tennis in the US and Canada
- » A non-profit organization, run purely by volunteers
- » The Championships is the culmination of the 2022-2023 NCTTA League
- » Over 150 participating colleges, competing in 6 regions, subdivided into 27 divisions, played in fall and spring academic semesters or quarters.
- » NCTTA offers college scholarships, and some colleges offer their own table tennis scholarships
- » Many international student-athletes
- » Primary competition format is teams: 4 singles plus 1 double
- » Categories are Men's/Coed Teams and Women's Teams; women may play in both

MEN'S/ COED TEAMS

New York University (New York, NY) – 2022 Defending Coed Team Champions, 2019 NYC Division Team winners, 2019 Northeast Regional Champions and 2018 National Champion Team winners, features Canadian Team star, Jeremy Hazin (World Rank #170). Coach Yan Jun Gao is former NCTTA 2010 Men's Singles Champion.

Rutgers University (New Brunswick, NJ) – 2022 Northeast Regional Champion, 2022 New York City Downtown Division Champion.

Texas Wesleyan University (Forth Worth, TX) – 13 time men's/coed team; 2019 Champion; led by a powerful women's duo of Zhen Deng and Jiaqi Lin. Texas Wesleyan Women's team has 10 women's team titles. They are currently the only scholarship school in the team competition. https://ramsports.net/sports/tt

Northwestern University (Chicago, IL) - Led by former US Junior phenom, Jack Wang and Michael Wolski. Northwestern were 2023 Upper Midwest Division Champions.

University of California, Berkeley (Berkeley, CA) – 2017, 2018 West Region Men's/Coed Champions, led by US National team player and

USATT Board member, Nikhil Kumar (World Rank #245). Kumar represented the USA in the Olympics in 2020 Tokyo and is the current US National Champion.

University of Southern California (Los Angeles, CA) – Led by US National Team member, 2018 Men's Singles Champion, Kai Zhang (World Rank #239) and current #1 seed in Men's Singles.

University of Texas at Austin (Austin, TX) – Almost the home team, only 20 minutes away from the Championships, led by a collection of young talent like Zixiang Meng and Jonathan Li.

University of Washington (Seattle, WA) - Led by former junior US champion, Sahil Puri. University of Washington was the 2023 Pacific Northwest Champions.

University of Maryland (College Park, MD) – UMD are champs of DC Division and MidAtlantic Regionals and are led by the brother duo of LeTuanKhoi and LeTuanKhai Dinh.

Columbia University (New York City, NY) – Finished in 1st in the NYC Division this year. Led by Tiancheng Wang who is 14-4 on the season.

Cornell University (Ithaca, NY) - 1st place in the 2023 Upstate NY West Division this year led by former US based youth stars, Emilie Lin and Nathan Wu.

University of Michigan (Ann Arbor, MI) – Undefeated in the 2022, 2023 Division campaign; led by State of Michigan Champion, NCTTA World University Games Team and US junior team member, Eliel Sosis.

University of Texas at Dallas (Dallas, TX) – 3rd place in 2022 NCTTA South Regional Championships led by US Based, Oliver Wang.

Washington University in St. Louis (St Louis, MO) – Led by former USA Cadet Boys team member, Shawn Fong.

Western University (London, ON, Canada) – Varsity sport program in Canada, led by Indian international and #1 player Manik Singh who is 21-1 in the season.

University of Pennsylvania (Philadelphia, PA) – 2023 Pennsylvania Division Champions led by Van Hu and Nathan Xu.

Carnegie Mellon University (Pittsburgh, PA) -2^{nd} appearance at the National Championships.

Harvard University (Cambridge, MA) – Led by #1 player Tianming Xie who consequently is a National Master in Chess! Harvard was 2022, 2023 Upper New England Division Champions and 2023 Northeast Regional Champions.

University of Massachusetts at Amherst

(Amherst, MA) – By far one of the most passionate schools in NCTTA, 2020 Northeast Regional Champions, qualified this year by Wildcard. Led by US based player, John McDermott.

University of California Los Angeles (Los Angeles, CA) - 2023 West Region Champions featuring a star studded team led by US Junior and National Team players, Amy Wang and Kai Zarehbin.

University of British Columbia (Vancouver, BC, Canada) - Led by Canadian National Team member Edison Huang and Ivy Liao.

Purdue University (West Lafayette, IN) -Wildcard team to the 2023 NCTTA Championships led by Bay Area Table Tennis junior star, Avery Chan.
