NCTTA is a National Organization Member of USA Table Tennis as well as a certified club. NCTTA was recognized as a National Organization member by the US Olympic committee/USA Table Tennis since 2008.

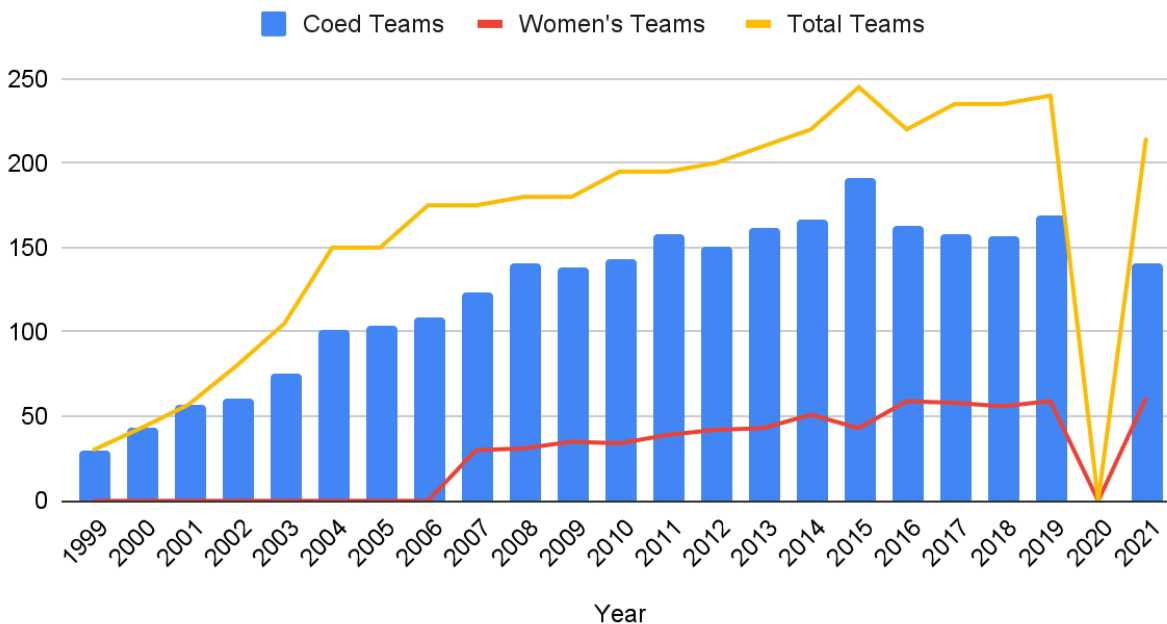
2. MAJOR SPONSORS



3. LEAGUE

The NCTTA league is the organization's main activity. The league consists of intercollegiate varsity team competition among Coed/Men's teams and among Women's teams. Varsity teams consist of at least 4 players; up to 8 players may be on a roster at any given time. Junior varsity teams and alumni teams are also invited to compete in scrimmage competition, and separate singles competitions are also held.

Coed Teams, Women's Teams and Total Teams

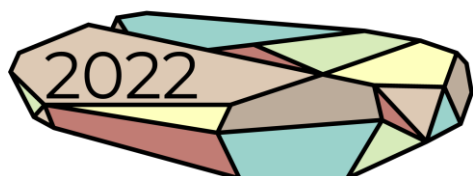


In the 2020-2021 season, regular season competition was canceled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. No schools signed up for NCTTA membership until Fall 2021 semester. NCTTA's competition season is played via an academic year which is from October to April. Regular season competition took place both in the fall and the spring, in six regions subdivided into 25 divisions. Almost 2000 competitive athletes participated, forming 141 Varsity Coed and 61 Varsity Women's teams and a total of over 300 teams. NCTTA also organizes singles play in division, regional and championship play.

Immediately following the regular season, the strongest teams and singles players were invited to 6 regional championships which also served as qualification events for the National Championships.

4. CHAMPIONSHIPS

COLLEGE TABLE TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS



The College Table Tennis Championships is NCTTA's premier event and the most professionally run table tennis event on the continent. Also coded as a 5 star sanctioned event comparable to the US Open. It is held over three days each spring, and the 2020 and 2021 Championships were supposed to be held in Round Rock, Texas. Months before each of the competitions, NCTTA took the proactive step to protect athletes, staff and volunteers and preserve the integrity of the organization thereby canceling the Championships due to the pandemic.

The 2022 Championships were one of the most competitive national events in our organization's history. This event was also one of the most protected events NCTTA has ever produced within the scope of the pandemic. All players, NCTTA staff and volunteers were required to turn in a negative PCR test and were tested daily. Masks were strongly encouraged as well as vaccination records. NCTTA had the responsibility to its membership and the overall table tennis community to make this a safe event.

A plethora of top tier players (over 270, we average 250) from 50 USA colleges and universities as well as international students from 23 countries to compete for team, singles, and doubles championship titles. In all, it is always a diverse event featuring North America's finest athletes from the national and world stage.

5. MEMBERSHIP

NCTTA is a membership organization formed by college table tennis clubs in North America. Individual athletes who wish to participate join NCTTA by forming a club at their college and subsequently registering their college with NCTTA.



Member schools can create Men's/Coed teams, Junior varsity teams and all women's teams.

NCTTA has a unique format that sees many times men playing women as female players are allowed to play on the Men's/Coed teams as seen here (Pic by Dennis Yanga).

Of note, NCTTA leverages relationships with local Table Tennis clubs and Colleges and Universities to host more than 60 events in the academic calendar (October to March).

Member colleges vary widely in their size, level of activity, and degree of support from their college administration. They include clubs which are organized as:

- Small clubs of few members, self-funded by students, peripherally recognized by their college.
- Medium-sized clubs which receive partial funding by the college.
- Large clubs with both Coed, Women's teams, with most expenses paid by the college.

Of particular note, three member schools offer table tennis programs and some with athletic scholarships/assistance: Texas Wesleyan University (Fort Worth, TX), Dallas Baptist University (Dallas, TX) and Fashion Institute of Technology (New York City, NY).

6. MEDIA

6.1 VIDEO



NCTTA Media team is comprised of all volunteers and mostly alumni from different areas like graphic design, journalism, video production and more. As a team we publish a monthly email newsletter that includes all current topics related to college table tennis and reaches over 4000 people providing exposure to sponsors and affiliates throughout the year.

The College Table Tennis Championships is streamed live in high definition on YouTube, in TV quality complete with four camera angles, live commentary, and replay on the Official NCTTA YouTube Channel and worked on by all volunteers once again.

5. National Organization Director:
a. If there is a National Organization Director, he or she shall be selected for one initial five (5) year term, expiring December 31st, 2012, or until his or her successor is elected (whichever comes later).

NCTTA stood up and fought for our rights as a National Organization. Hundreds of alumni and current members banded together to show support through (social media, email campaigns, NCTTA website (see below) and [zoom townhall gatherings](#)) all for NCTTA in their time of need. Our activism forced the NGB to take a hard look at their behavior in the matter.

[USATT/NCTTA conflict](#) combined with the power of social media created an avenue for current and former College Table Tennis athletes to come together to make a change in a positive way.

Ultimately a robust alumni network flourished and the National Fundraiser came about where an anonymous alumni donor offered 100k to NCTTA due to this conflict with the NGB.

7. SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

NCTTA offers scholarships up to \$500 to future NCTTA athletes (currently in high school) based on GPA, financial need, table tennis ability, and an essay. Scholarships to high school-only athletes are a recent change to the program in the hopes of promoting high school play and continued college play. This [program](#) has been in place since 2009. Funded originally by Newgy Industries and now for the 2022 Scholarship cycle it will be funded by the Hsing Family Foundation. The 2021 scholarships were awarded to:

8. MANAGEMENT AND STAFF

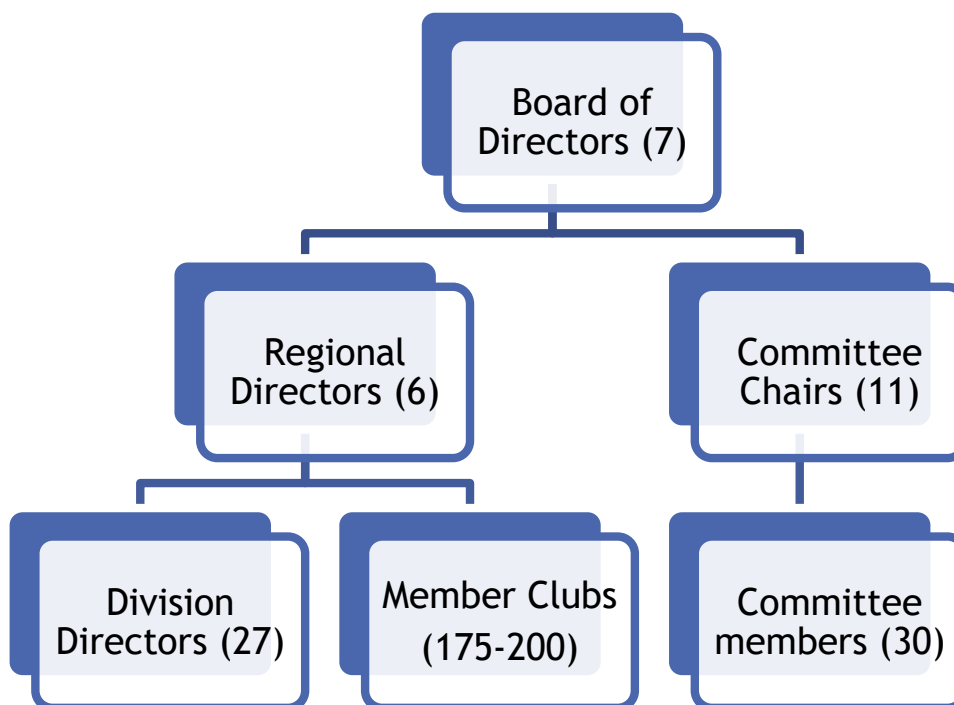
The NCTTA Executive Board governs and manages the organization. The board (seen below) consists of 7 volunteer directors, each with specific duties doubling as almost a front office staff.



The six NCTTA regions are managed by Regional Directors, and the NCTTA divisions are managed by Division Directors. The number of divisions varies each year; during the pandemic however, no competition was held.

Committees oversee various specific areas. Current committees include Alumni, Ethics/ Grievance, Championships, Coaches, High School, Enrollment, Marketing, Media, Ratings, Recruiting, Technology, and Women.

NCTTA conducts six regional tournaments around the USA and Canada and this year streaming was introduced. Each region now has commentators and our next approach is getting dedicated graphics for each regional stream.

Statistics for 2021 were not available since no regional tournaments were conducted, but 2022 Regional statistics were available.

10. PARTNERSHIPS

NCTTA sought out much support from the table tennis community and was able to partner with [American Youth Table Tennis Organization](#) (AYTTO) and [LA Ping Pong](#) to further its goals in growing the pipeline through high school table tennis.



NCTTA with the AYTTO has garnered support to recruit assistant coaches (NCTTA college players) for AYTTO's high school, middle school and league and elementary after school programs in New York City. NCTTA college students are primarily in the NYC Public School Athletic League assistant coaching program.

In addition, NCTTA and AYTTO came together to offer the George Braithwaite Community Service Award and Scholarship. It will recognize individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the sport of Table Tennis and will offer up to \$5,000 scholarship for a high school senior in the AYTTO family who is entering college and exhibits outstanding volunteerism for our sport.



NCTTA President, Willy Leparulo spoke at the ITTF 50 years of Ping Pong Diplomacy Celebration for the life of George Braithwaite. The event took place October 2021 in New York City's Roosevelt Island's Capobianco Field.

LA Ping Pong is a 501c3 non for profit organization with a goal to boost table tennis participation and competitive table tennis opportunities in Southern California. Their board includes many NCTTA alumni and partners: Alex Figueroa (NCTTA Southern California Director), David Del Vecchio and Jack McCarthy (NCTTA Alumni). NCTTA is happy to promote LA Ping Pong's initiatives as they promote ours.





NCTTA was able to partner with the 888 Table Tennis Club during its National Fundraiser to host the West coast Alumni party. A live party idea for NCTTA Alumni to gather, play pong, socialize and support NCTTA. The Triple Eight Table Tennis club and NCTTA cohosted the event in August 2021 at the Burlingame, California club location.



NCTTA and Rotary Sports Unlimited entered into a partnership during the 2021 NCTTA National Fundraiser when they sponsored the *#memory* campaign. Rotary Sports Unlimited crafts equipment and training aids designed to improve the playing experience for Table Tennis and Golf enthusiasts.

11. CONFERENCES-EXTERNAL AFFAIRS

NCTTA is committed to attracting the best locations for its National Championship through conferences. Two conferences were attended with special regard at attracting competitive cities and facilities for our Championship event.

NCTTA attended the 2021 Connect Sports Conference in Tampa, Florida and the 2021 Teams Sport Conference in Atlantic City, New Jersey. NCTTA representatives attending: Brandon Lawrence (Athlete Rep) at teams and Joseph Wells (VP External), Andy Nguyen (Marketing) and Willy Leparulo (President) at Connect Conference were in attendance.

Leparulo says “Attending these conferences always gives us a chance in understanding how to better partner with potential hosts. We are amazingly fortunate to be able to attend these events”.

12. PROGRAMS

12.1 COACHING COMMITTEE



NCTTA Coaching Committee in 2021 continued the certification training with a new sponsor to tote, Butterfly. NCTTA's past coaching trainings have all been face to face and sponsored by iSET. August 2021 at the AGTTA (Atlanta Georgia Table Tennis Association), NCTTA conducted its first face to face coaching certification in almost two years.

The trainings will continue to use ITTF Level 1 handbook as well as our own NCTTA sourced materials. Special thanks to ITTF's Glen Tepper for permission to use the ITTF Level 1 handbook and to our mentor Richard McAfee who taught all of the course instructors and is one of the reasons this certification still exists today.

It should be noted that prior to the pandemic, NCTTA had certified [49 College Coaches](#) across North America. Currently there are more than 80 college coaches in our system.

The goal is to impact retention and professionalism in coaching and in NCTTA college table tennis.

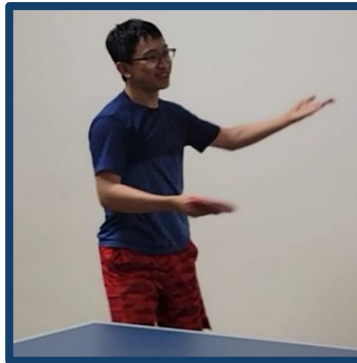
13. INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

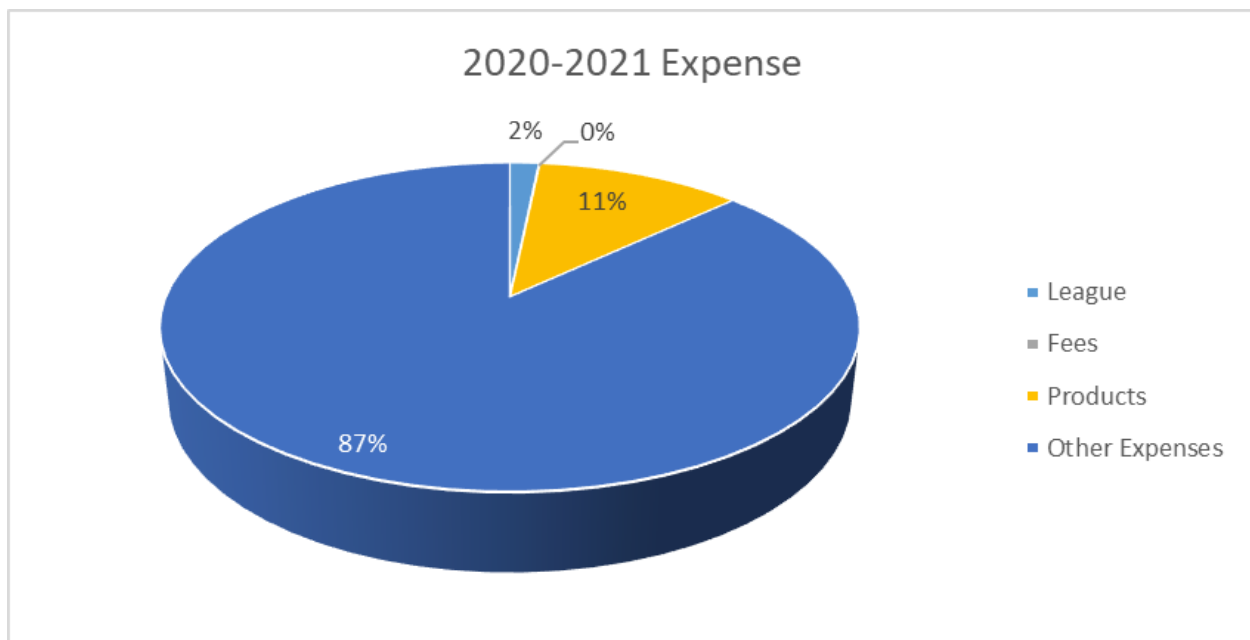

16. FINANCIAL STATUS

A look at NCTTA's income shows a large percentage of membership fees from member schools with the remainder coming from its other events. Note the pandemic created some issues this year in our finances.



NCTTA did not manage a competition until the Fall 2021 semester. Most of 2021 there were no competitions hence a different expense and income ratio.

17. NATIONAL TEAM ATHLETES

Year after year, NCTTA has been a home to former and current Junior/National athletes from the USA, Canada and other countries.

Representing one's country while being in college is not an easy feat and one that takes coordination, support and true grit. Trailblazers like Lily Zhang (UC Berkeley) and others have paved the way for the new group to step into the light.

This is a testament to our sport and how it has changed from the previous narrative of juniors quitting the sport to pursue College/University education.

A myriad of collegiate athletes that once competed for USA Table Tennis teams as juniors or even on the national team should be noted.

On the women's side there are student athletes like Angela Guan of UC Berkeley, and Lucy Ma of Stanford, among others.

On the men's side, Sharon and Gal Alguetti (Indiana University), Kai Zhang (USC), Nikhil Kumar (UC Berkeley), Eric Pattison (University of Washington), Jack Wang (Northwestern) and more are continuing their table tennis success while enrolled in college or university and playing in the NCTTA.

18. NATIONAL TEAM ATHLETES

The [FISU World University Games](#) is College Table Tennis' version of our World Cup and Super Bowl rolled into one. NCTTA has been successfully organizing a TEAM USA College team to attend since 2006. NCTTA formalized the process as they once did in 2006 by having the World University Games trials at another 5 star event, the US Open 2021 in December.

Unfortunately, the last several years the World University games have been cancelled due to the pandemic. NCTTA currently manages the games through the World University Games committee and its members (Brandon Lawrence, Stephanie Shih, Willy Leparulo and Jasna Rather).



The USA Men's and Women's team consisted of top NCTTA athletes that met the FISU eligibility rules.

The Men's Team was Nikhil Kumar (UC Berkeley), Jonathan Li (University of Texas), Eiel Solis (University of Michigan), Steven Gong (UC Davis) and Joshua Mak (University of North Texas).

The Women's team was Angela Guan (UC Berkeley), Crystal Wang (Emory University), Lucy Ma (Stanford University), Stephanie Zhang (University of Maryland) and Lavanya Maruthapandian (UC Berkeley).

Expect to see several college table tennis players compete for spots for Olympics and National Team competitions.

19.3 VOLUNTEERISM AND COMMUNITY

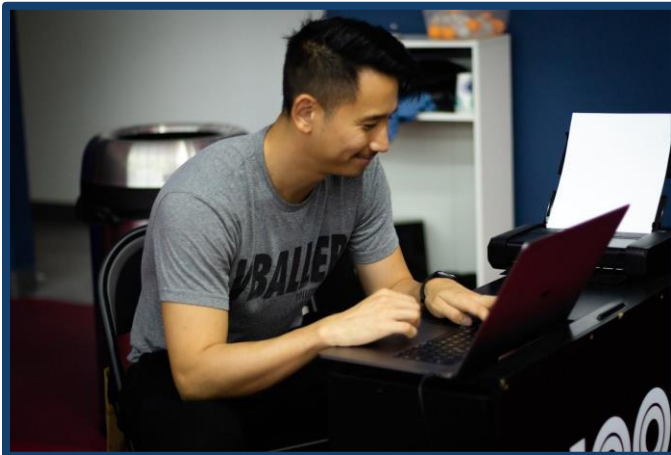
